

Media Update – Taste of Charlotte Street Closures

Taste of Charlotte Celebrates 19 Years of Taste!

Taste of Charlotte brings its eats and treats to uptown next week. In addition to great food from over 30 of the area's best restaurants, you'll find Kid's Activities brought to you by Shipt with fun and games for kids, The MarketPlace with one-of-a-kind handcrafted art, jewelry, clothing and more, live entertainment on the Center Stage presented by Lidl and Inside the Tavern at the Taste Presented by Corona Light.

Below is handy information about street closures and parking to ensure you arrive to the festival safely.

Street Closures

The managing staff of Taste of Charlotte works with the City of Charlotte to make as little impact as possible on daily commuting of uptown workers.

The plan used this year is the same plan as last year's Taste of Charlotte festival. When the festival moves into uptown Charlotte to begin setup on Thursday, June 8th, Tryon Street from Stonewall to Fifth Street will close at 9:00 am.

Trade Street from Church to College will also close at 9:00am on Thursday, June 8th

The cross streets of Levine, MLK, Third, and Fourth and will remain open until 6:00pm following rush hour traffic on Thursday afternoon. At 6:00pm on Thursday, June 8th, these cross streets will close for the night.

The intersections of MLK, Third, Fourth and streets will reopen from 6:00 a.m. – 9:00am on Friday, June 9 for rush hour traffic. Note that Levine Ave does not re-open on Friday morning.

Following the rush-hour traffic, on Friday, June 9th the following will be closed to traffic for the entire weekend:

Tryon Street between Stonewall and 5th Street
Stonewall and 5th Street will remain open all weekend

Levine Ave from Tryon to Church Streets

MLK Street from College to Church Streets

Third Street from College to Church Streets

Fourth Street from College to Church streets

Trade Street from College to Church streets

The streets listed above will reopen in time for Monday morning rush hour.

Parking

Many spaces are available for parking on the streets, all free after 6 p.m. and all day on the weekends.
